







WELCOME TO AARHUS






DO YOU KNOW?

- recognized as a "must visit" destination by powerhouse publications such as Lonely Planet, CNN, New York Times, Vouge, and National Geographic.










A SUSTAINABLE FOCUS


- 72% of all hotel rooms in the city center hold an official ecocertification.

- When in the city, everything is within easy walking distance, alternatively by bike or a short ride with the light rail.



SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY AND SUSTAINABILITY

We strive to reduce the environmental impact of the conference and focus on the values of sustainability, equality and inclusion, which the conference will showcase. However, we are not perfect, and therefore, we have developed these 7 points that we are committed in following.

- Promote more CO2 friendly transport forms
- 2 Secure broad representation of male and female speakers and focus on geographical diversity
- Use local and seasonal products in cooking
- 4 Rethink the tradition of the conference bag. We suggest a 'Conference Bag Bar' at the Registration, where participants can take what they need
- Ask the participants to bring their own water bottle. Denmark has some of the best tap water in the world, so there is no need to buy water in plastic bottles
- 6 Choose an easy access venue for the conference, welcome reception and conference dinner, making sure that participants with disabilities can participateon equal terms
- Everything is in walking distance making walk fun by integrating local ReThinkers as part of the conference programme







VENUE: AARHUS UNIVERSITY

Aarhus University – a world-class architectural experience, by some considered one of the most beautiful universities on the planet, including Huffington Post.

The Biomag Conference will take place at Aarhus University in the new campus facilities, which will open in 2025. The expansion will provide Aarhus University with additional 37,000 square meter buildings for teaching, research, and conferences.

The heart of the new campus will be the round building for an auditorium with 800 seats, perfect for the Biomag Conference. There will be plenty of space on the new campus facilities to fit multiple parallel sessions within a very short walking distance.

The area is connected to the University Park via three underground passages.





VENUE CONTINUED

THE NEW CAMPUS 2.0

Most of conference will be at the new campus facility, called Campus 2.0. For the new university city, we can expect:

- One big auditorium seating 800 people, or it can be split up in 400+200+200.
- Two auditoriums seating 125 people.
- One auditorium seating 150 people.
- Four classrooms seating 70 people.

We also have the opportunity to use the Lake Side Theatres, among others, in the University Park. These can be reached with a short walk by foot.






WELCOME RECEPTION

We propose a welcome reception at the iconic City Hall, located within few minutes' walk from The Central Station.

Aarhus City Hall, although more than 75 years old, is a modern, functionalistic building that houses the Municipality of Aarhus and hosts major events through-out the year. Built between 1937 and 1942 and designed by the famous architects Arne Jakobsen and Erik Møller, the City Hall is cladded with Norwegian marble on the outside, and inside, brass and wood make an elegant impression.







CONFERENCE DINNER

A lasting impression of Aarhus will be created during the evening of the conference dinner. Guests can look forward to a culinary experience in the city centre.

CENTRALVÆRKSTEDET


Centralværkstedet was built in 1862 and used by the Danish State Railways as a repair shop. Today, the building is completely renovated and refurbished with acoustic ceilings, new heating equipment, a state-of-the-art kitchen and is suitable for up to 900 guests.

RADISSON BLU SCANDINAVIA/ AARHUS CONGRESS CENTER

Radisson Blu Scandinavia is a great place for a conference dinner. Enjoy fine dining, top-notch acoustics and an environment perfect for networking. Located in the city centre, across from the City Hall and next to the Concert Hall and the popular ARoS Aarhus Art Museum and a short walk from the central train station.

BY ROAD


Getting to Denmark is easy. Denmark is a peninsula in Northern Europe, which means you can go by car or train from any of the European countries. Denmark has an extensive transport network of train, bus and roads and for groups of delegates coming from across mainland Europe, making arrangements for group travel by car, minibus, coach or train can be a more cost effective and environmentally friendly option.

BY TRAIN

The Danish railway system is clean, friendly, safe, and efficient and routes connecting Aarhus to Copenhagen run frequently every hour. Aarhus is mainly connected to Europe by a railway hub in Hamburg, reached within four hours. From here you will find connections to larger European cities and within 14 hours you can reach Aarhus by train from a great part of Europe - Munich, Amsterdam, Brussels, Frankfurt, Prague, Paris, Berlin, and Vienna.

BY AIR

Aarhus is well connected by air with two nearby airports, Billund and Aarhus, connected to the main airport hubs in Europe. There are direct train connections to Copenhagen Airport and Aalborg Airport.

BILLUND AIRPORT

- Second largest airport in Denmark with more than 110 direct connections.
- Shuttle busses leave every hour and take you straight to the centre of Aarhus.
- Direct flights to Amsterdam, Paris, Frankfurt, London, Riga, Reykjavik, Copenhagen, Madrid, Brussels, Warsaw and Helsinki, Berlin, Zürich, Düsseldorf, Vienna, Barcelona, Rome, Budapest, Athens, Prague, Edinburgh, Dublin, ect.

AARHUS AIRPORT



NATURE

We suggest to offer a tour with focus on nature experiences with dinner included.

Visit Mols Bjerge National Park - a fantastic and varied nature consisting of a large part of the Danish nature types, but also some of Denmark's rarest nature. Its hallmark is the extraordinary ice age landscape. Food will be cooked at the bonfire with food ingredienses collected in the surronding nature.

Enjoy a **RIB boat tour** on the Aarhus Bay. Learn about Aarhus History from a Viking City to how the Viking King Harald Bluetooth ended his days.



CULTURE

We suggest a visit to one of the city's cultural highlights with a tour and dinner.

ARoS Art Museum, one of the largest museums in Northern Europe, where you can visit the spectacular "Your rainbow panorama" by Olafur Eliasson. In 2025, the monumental artwork "The Dome" will open, by James Turrell, the world's leading artists of the light and space movement.

At **Moesgaard Museum**, you can hear tales of the Vikings, when prehistory is presented innovatively in a breathtaking architectural setting. The exhibits provide insight into prehistory and anthropology in surprising way.



GASTRONOMY

We suggest a tour with focus on gastronomy.

A Food Walk will take participants through the city and try out local specialties. Hear how restaurants shaped the city's development.

The Exclusive Gastronomy Experience will be at one of the city's high-end restaurant, whether it will be a MICHELIN or MICHELIN Bib Gourmand, introducing participants to the New Nordic Cuisine.


A TASTE OF AARHUS
